APRIL FINANCE NEWS

Our income for the month was £7,472 and expenditure was £9,769. Income included: £1,648 giving in church collections; £3,162 hall rent; £2,562 rent from Ingleby Road flats. Expenditure included: £4,483 monthly parish share paid to the diocese; £219 insurance; £545 gas and electricity; £984 annual refuse payment to LB Redbridge; £1,896 electric circuits check (required every 5 years); £264 hall cleaning.

FLY TIPPING

It's become apparent in recent weeks that the area outside the church in Balfour Road is increasingly being used for the fly tipping of domestic waste. Redbridge Council Cleansing Department have been made aware of the problem.

It would be helpful if anyone who sees rubbish that has been fly tipped outside the church could phone Redbridge Council on 020 8554 5000 to report it. From the switchboard menu you then need option 5, followed by option 2. If fly tipping is reported to the Council they remove it, and search through waste bags looking for evidence of who is responsible.

Risen, ascended Lord,

First Reading: Acts 1: 15-17, 21-26

In those days Peter stood up among the believers (together the crowd numbered about one hundred and twenty people). He said, 'Friends, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit through David foretold concerning Judas, who became a guide for those who arrested Jesus – for he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry. So one of the men who have accompanied us throughout the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us – one of these must become a witness with us to his resurrection.' So they proposed two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and Matthias. Then they prayed and said, 'Lord, you know everyone's heart. Show us which one of these

two you have chosen to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place.' And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias; and he was added to the eleven apostles.
